I Kings 3:11-14:

And God said unto him, Because thou hast asked this thing, and hast not asked for thyself long life; neither hast asked riches for thyself, nor hast asked the life of thine enemies; but hast asked for thyself understanding to discern judgment;

Behold, I have done according to thy words: lo, I have given thee a wise and an understanding heart; so that there was none like thee before thee, neither after thee shall any arise like unto thee.

And I have also given thee that which thou hast not asked, both riches, and honour: so that there shall not be any among the kings like unto

And if thou wilt walk in my ways, to keep my statutes and my commandments, as thy father David did walk, then I will lengthen thy days.

I was blessed to see Solomon's love for God and his desire to grow in spiritual understanding in his service to God. These things were more important to him than gaining the riches of this world. As a result, God blessed his life very abundantly in the physical realm too. Several other scriptures established this for me.

Psalms 1:2,3:

But his [the man's] delight is in the law of the Lord; and in his law doth he meditate day and night.

And he shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water, that bringeth forth his fruit in his season; his leaf also shall not wither; and whatsoever he doeth shall prosper.

Matthew 6:33:

But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you.

Ephesians 3:20:

Now unto him that is able to do exceeding abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that worketh in us.

These are some of the scriptures that helped convince me that a life of service to God would be full and abundant. As I look back over the past thirty-five years, that's exactly what happened and continues to happen.

As I serve, I have seen growth in my spiritual understanding year after year in leading God's people. I have had the privilege to develop my teaching ability with believing to inspire others to live the Word more dynamically. I have also had the joy of winning people to the Word and helping others do the same. And I have become more proficient at operating the nine manifestations of holy spirit.
