Serving in The Way Ministry, I've enjoyed opportunities and experiences that I never would have had otherwise, and my personal and family life has been abundantly blessed. By God's grace, once we have been born again, we can serve Him. There is an unequaled satisfaction in serving God. And we can serve confidently, knowing that we can never outgive God.

Luke 6:38: Give, and it shall be given unto you; good measure, pressed down, and shaken together, and running over, shall men give into your bosom. For with the same measure that ye mete withal it shall be measured to you again.

As we give, God bountifully blesses us with His abundance in our lives. God does not forget our work, and He is faithful to reward us for our labor.

Hebrews 6:10: For God is not unrighteous to forget your work and labour of love, which ye have shewed toward his name, in that ye have ministered to the saints, and do minister.
