John 3:16:

The word "ministry" in I Corinthians 16:15 means service or attendance. The household of Stephanas had voluntarily devoted themselves to be of service to the believers, to care for them. They were not forced; they chose to do so as a result of their thankfulness for what God had given them. This is such a great example of how believers can choose to serve to a greater degree as they love God and are thankful for His deeds in their lives.

God has called us to serve one another in love.

Galatians 5:13:

For, brethren, ye have been called unto liberty; only use not liberty for an occasion to the flesh, but by love serve one another.

We get to determine how we are to use our liberty, our freedom. God exhorts us to not use our liberty as "an occasion to the flesh." "Flesh" in this verse represents the old-man nature. We don't use our liberty to satisfy selfish desires that exclude a genuine concern for the welfare of others. We want to use our freedom to care for and do good to others, especially to them who are of the household of faith (Galatians 6:10).

God has accomplished a great deal for us, and we have free will to serve Him. We are thankful for all that He has given us.
